WHAT WE BELIEVE

The Bible is God's inspired, infallible, and authoritative Word (*Psalms 119; Matthew 4:4; Luke 24:2*).

There is one God, existing eternally as three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (*1 John 5:7*).

Jesus Christ is fully divine, born of a virgin, lived without sin, performed miracles, died as our substitute to atone for sin, rose bodily from the dead, ascended to the Father's right hand, and will return in power and glory to reign on earth for a thousand years (*John 1:1-4; Ephesians 2:13-18; Revelation 19-20*).

The Blessed Hope is the Rapture, when Christ returns for His Church (*1 Thessalonians 4:13-18*).

Salvation comes only through repentance and faith in Christ's shed blood (*Romans 5:1; Ephesians 2:8-9, 13-18*).

The Holy Spirit's regeneration is essential for salvation (*John 3:5-8; Titus 3:5*).

Christ's work on the cross enables physical healing through faith-filled prayer (*Exodus 15:25-26; James 5:14-15; 1 Peter 2:24*).

The Baptism with the Holy Spirit, evidenced by speaking in tongues, is available to all believers who seek it (*Acts 2:4; 10:44-46; 19:1-7*).

The Holy Spirit empowers Christians to live holy lives through His indwelling presence (*Romans 6:3-14; 8:1-2, 11*).

Marriage is a sacred union established by God between one man and one woman, as determined by their biological sex at birth (*Genesis 2:18-24; Matthew 19:4-6*).

Sexual immorality—including adultery, fornication, homosexuality, bisexuality, bestiality, incest, pornography, or rejecting one's biological sex—is sinful and contrary to God's design (*Genesis 1:27; Leviticus 18; Deuteronomy 22:5; 32:4; Jeremiah 1:5; Romans 1:18-32; 1 Corinthians 6:18-20; 1 Timothy 1:10*).

The saved will rise to eternal life, and the lost to eternal judgment (*Revelation 20:5-6, 11-15*).

Course Modules

COURSE 1

Pentecostal Theology (Bible Doctrines)

Pentecostal Theology centers on the dynamic work of the Holy Spirit as revealed in Scripture, emphasizing the continuity of spiritual gifts like tongues, prophecy, and healing from Acts 2 into the present day. It explores core Bible doctrines—such as the Trinity, salvation, and sanctification—through a lens that celebrates the Holy Spirit’s empowerment for holy living and bold witness in the church.

This course equips students to understand and defend these beliefs against cessationist views, rooting their faith in the authority of God’s Word. It fosters a vibrant, experiential relationship with God, preparing believers to operate in the supernatural as part of their daily Christian walk.

The Hypostatic Union of Christ (Divinity and Humanity of Christ)

The hypostatic union teaches that Jesus Christ is one person with two natures—fully divine, possessing all the attributes of God, and fully human, experiencing life as we do, yet without sin. This doctrine, affirmed in early church councils like Chalcedon, underscores His unique role as the eternal Son who became flesh (John 1:14) to redeem humanity.

For Spirit-filled believers, this truth inspires worship of Jesus as both sovereign Lord and relatable Savior, while also affirming His power to heal and deliver through His humanity. Students learn how this union enables Christ to bridge the gap between God and man, securing salvation and modeling a Spirit-filled life.

Hermeneutics - Typology

Hermeneutics is the science of interpreting Scripture accurately, and understanding typology within it which examines how Old Testament figures, events, or institutions prefigure Christ and New Testament realities. For example, the bronze serpent (Numbers 21) typifies Jesus’ crucifixion, lifted up for our healing and salvation (John 3:14-15).

This course trains students to see the Bible as a unified story of redemption, enhancing their ability to preach and teach with depth. By recognizing types like the tabernacle or Jonah as shadows of Christ, they gain insight into God’s eternal plan and apply these truths to modern Pentecostal faith and practice.



Course Modules (cont.)

God's Plan for Man Through the Seven Feasts

The seven feasts of Israel—Passover, Unleavened Bread, First fruits, Pentecost, Trumpets, Atonement, and Tabernacles—outline God's redemptive timeline for humanity, each fulfilled or to be fulfilled in Christ. Passover, for instance, points to Jesus' sacrificial death, while Pentecost marks the Spirit's outpouring (Acts 2), empowering the church.

A study of these seven feasts will cause one to grasp God's covenant love and His promise of ultimate restoration, anticipating Christ's return at Trumpets and the kingdom's fullness in Tabernacles. This course will be an eye opener to the inquisitive student to discover God's plan for the ages and to prepare the latter to position themselves rightly.

The Book of Galatians

Galatians, penned by Paul, defends the Gospel of grace against legalism, asserting that salvation comes through faith in Christ alone, not adherence to the Mosaic Law (Galatians 2:16). It rebukes the Judaizers' influence and celebrates the freedom and new life believers receive through the Spirit.

This power-packed book highlights the Spirit's role in salvation and sanctification urging them to walk in liberty rather than bondage to works. It is a call to reject religious formalism, embrace the Cross's sufficiency, and live victoriously by faith in God's promises.

Martin Luther, the German theologian and reformer, indeed had a special affinity for the book of Galatians. In fact, he often referred to it as his "Katherine von Bora" (the name of his wife), indicating how dear it was to him.

Luther's love for Galatians stemmed from its emphasis on justification by faith alone, a doctrine that was central to the Protestant Reformation. He saw Galatians as a powerful rebuke to the legalism and works-based salvation prevalent in the Catholic Church of his time.

In his commentary on Galatians, Luther wrote, "The Epistle to the Galatians is my epistle, in which I have poured out my heart and soul." His affection for Galatians reflects the significant impact it had on his theology and the Reformation as a whole.

The Book of Romans (Church History)

The book of Romans is known as the book of Reformation and the book that changed the world. Romans presents a systematic theology of salvation, explaining how all—Jew and Gentile—are justified by faith in Christ's atoning work (Romans 3:23-24), apart from the law. Paul unpacks sin's universal grip, God's righteousness, and the Spirit's transformative power, making it foundational for Christian doctrine.

In church history, Romans shaped Augustine's conversion, Luther's Reformation, and Wesley's revival, emphasizing grace over works. Students will explore its impact, seeing the Spirit's outpouring as the fulfillment of its promise of life in Christ, equipping them to proclaim this truth boldly. Through Romans, Paul addresses key theological themes such as imputation, adoption, and sanctification, emphasizing the transformative power of the Gospel to save and redeem humanity. This foundational epistle has profoundly shaped Christian theology and remains a cornerstone of biblical study and reflection.



Course Modules (cont.)

The Foundations of the Faith

The Foundations of Faith lays out essential Christian doctrines—The five solas, Christ’s atonement, the Spirit’s work, and the church’s mission—drawn from Scripture, church fathers, and systematic theology. It traces these truths through history, from the apostles to modern Pentecostal renewal, grounding students in unchanging belief.

This course strengthens believers to stand firm in faith, offering a framework to resist false teachings and grow spiritually. It connects theology to practice, showing how doctrine fuels prayer, worship, and supernatural ministry in the Spirit-filled life.

Proseucheology - 1

Proseucheology - 1 The theology and the prowess of prayer. This course explores prayer as a vital, Spirit-led conversation with God, rooted in biblical examples like Jesus’ prayers and the early church’s intercession (Acts 4:31). It teaches prayer as both communion with God and a weapon of faith to move mountains. Students will learn the principles and potency of prayer to advance their personal lives and their calling. They will also have an in-depth study of the prayer life of Jesus and learn the secrets of an effective prayer life.

Proseucheology - 2

Proseucheology - 2 advances students into deeper dimensions and authority of prayer, emphasizing intercession and praying in the Spirit (Ephesians 6:18). It teaches students to align their requests with God’s heart for greater

impact.

Students will learn to wield prayer as a weapon establishing the authority of the believer for breakthroughs, revival, and winning in spiritual warfare. This course fosters a lifestyle of persistent, faith-filled prayer, preparing them to see God’s power released in their lives and communities.

Pneumatology - The Holy Spirit, the Supernatural, and You

Pneumatology examines the Holy Spirit’s person and work—His deity, role in creation, and outpouring at Pentecost—focusing on His supernatural gifts like tongues, healing, and prophecy (1 Corinthians 12). It reveals Him as the believer’s Helper, empowering victorious living. This course bridges theology and experience, encouraging students to understand the power of the the Spirit’s baptism, the charismata gifts and how to operate in these gifts. The key to the supernatural is to operate in the charismata gifts for without them we have only word. Therefore the necessity for the Holy Spirit’s intimacy and power is a must in order to minister effectively in a world hungry for the miraculous.

Glossalalia

Glossalalia, or speaking in tongues, is a supernatural gift of the Spirit, first seen at Pentecost (Acts 2:4), where believers pray or praise in languages unknown to them. It is both a sign of Spirit baptism and a means of edifying oneself spiritually (1 Corinthians 14:4). This course defends tongues as a present-day blessing, teaching students to embrace it as a prayer language and a tool for deeper

communion with God. It prepares them to explain and model this gift, fostering expectancy for the Spirit's move in their lives. Through glossolalia the students will learn how to actively and deliberately draw on the help of the Spirit and they will learn of more than 101 benefits of praying in tongues.

New Creation Realities - 1

New Creation Realities teaches that believers, born again in Christ, are new beings (2 Corinthians 5:17), freed from sin's dominion and alive in the Spirit. This identity shifts them from condemnation to righteousness, power, and purpose in God's family.

Pentecostal students explore how this truth unlocks healing, authority, and boldness, reflecting Christ's victory. The course inspires them to live out their divine nature, rejecting the old life and embracing the supernatural realities of their salvation.

Principles of Faith - 1

The Principles of Faith introduces students to the dynamic power of aggressive faith, the foundation for everyday living and dominion over the world, the flesh and the devil. This course explores how bold belief and authoritative confession, grounded in Scripture, enables believers to impose God's promises over life's challenges. Students will study key principles—faith as a force, the spoken word's dominion, and the believer's covenant authority—drawing from foundational teachings to ignite spiritual breakthroughs.

Through focused lessons, students will grasp

how to wield aggressive faith with confidence, confronting obstacles and claiming victory in areas like healing and prosperity.

By mastering these tools, they will emerge equipped to live out an unshakeable, faith-driven life, ready to impact their world.

Faith is the key to a victorious life, equipping the saints to see the Spirit move as they believe God's unchanging truth.



Course Modules (cont.)

The Authority of the Believer

Unleashing Your Kingdom Influence

The Authority of the Believer asserts that Christians, through Christ's victory over sin and Satan, have delegated power to overcome evil (Luke 10:19). They will discover the explosive truths about their authority in Christ!

Course Highlights:

- Understand your identity as a believer and inheritance in Christ
- Learn to operate in the authority of the believer, releasing God's power in every area of life
- Discover how to speak faith-filled words, framing your world with the power of the spoken word
- Overcome fear, doubt, and unbelief, walking in confidence and boldness

Pentecostal theology ties this to the Spirit's anointing, enabling believers to heal the sick, cast out demons, and advance God's kingdom. Students learn to wield this authority confidently, rooted in their union with Christ and dependence on the Spirit.

Christ the Healer

Jesus had a healing ministry. This module endeavors to reveal the present day healing ministry of Jesus Christ. It proclaims Jesus as the one who heals body and soul, as seen in His ministry (Matthew 8:16-17) and promised in His atonement (Isaiah 53:5). Pentecostals believe this healing continues today through faith and the Spirit's gifts. This course equips students with the doctrine of divine healing. It shows

the three levels of, divine healing, divine health and divine life. Furthermore it answers a lot of questions that people have in regards to the subject of healing. This course asserts that we are not effective if we are not praying for the sick with expectancy, trusting Christ's compassion and power. It counters doubt with testimonies and Scripture, preparing the students to minister healing as a sign of God's love and kingdom.

The Life of Christ

The Life of Christ traces Jesus' earthly journey—His birth, teachings, miracles, death, and resurrection—revealing Him as God's Son and humanity's Savior (John 20:31). His Spirit-filled example shows us how to live in obedience and power.

For Pentecostal students, this course inspires imitation of Christ's compassion and authority, urging them to preach, heal, and disciple as He did. It deepens their love for Jesus, fueling a life devoted to His mission and glory.

Personal Leadership

Personal Leadership focuses on stewarding one's life with discipline, integrity, and reliance on the Spirit before leading others. It reflects biblical leaders like Moses, who grew through obedience and faith (Hebrews 11:24-27).

This course teaches students to prioritize prayer, character, and vision, preparing them for ministry by aligning their hearts with God's. For Pentecostals, it's about leading oneself first under the Spirit's guidance, ensuring a strong foundation for kingdom impact.

COURSE 2

New Testament Survey - 1

New Testament Survey - 1 overviews the 27 books, from the Gospels' account of Jesus' life to Revelation's promise of His return, showing God's plan of salvation through Christ. It highlights the Spirit's role in the early church as a model for today.

Pentecostal students study these texts to understand their faith's roots and apply their truths practically. The course reveals how the New Testament equips believers for worship, witness, and supernatural ministry in the Spirit's power.

Missiology

Missiology explores the theology and practice of missions, fulfilling Christ's command to make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:19-20). It blends evangelism, cultural understanding, and reliance on the Spirit to spread the Gospel globally.

For Pentecostals, this course emphasizes the Spirit's miraculous signs—like healing and

tongues—as tools to reach the lost. It prepares students to go boldly, trusting God to confirm His Word with power in diverse settings.

How to Be Led by the Holy Spirit

Being led by the Holy Spirit means discerning His guidance through Scripture, prayer, and inner peace (Romans 8:14), aligning one's life with God's will. It is a daily walk of sensitivity to His voice and promptings.

As the Lord spoke through Zechariah, 'It is not by might nor by power but by my Spirit'. Thus the leading of the Spirit is vital for effective ministry and personal growth, teaching students to trust the Spirit's direction over human wisdom. The course equips them to hear and obey, ensuring their steps reflect God's purpose.

The Laws of Revival

The Laws of Revival uncover biblical principles—like prayer, repentance, and hunger for God—that spark spiritual awakenings, as seen at Pentecost or in historical revivals like Azusa Street. These laws show God's desire to refresh His people.

This course inspires Pentecostal students to seek revival personally and corporately, trusting the Spirit to move mightily. It examines past outpourings to prepare them to lead others into a fresh encounter with God's presence.

The Fruit and Gifts of the Spirit

The fruit of the Spirit—like love, joy, and patience (Galatians 5:22-23)—reflects Christ's character in believers, while gifts—like prophecy

and healing (1 Corinthians 12)—equip them for ministry. The fruit of the Spirit is the unveiling of the person of Christ whereas the gifts is the unveiling of the power of Christ. Both flow from the Spirit's presence. This course helps Pentecostal students cultivate fruit through surrender and pursue gifts through faith, balancing personal growth with supernatural service. It prepares them to bless the church and demonstrate God's power to the world.

Understanding Ministry

Understanding Ministry defines God's call to serve His people with love, humility, and Spirit-led purpose, as modelled by Jesus (Mark 10:45). It covers roles like preaching, teaching, and caring for souls. This course defines the ministry and gives keys to excellence in ministry. It will equip the students to discern their calling and step into it with confidence and dependence on God.

Submission and Authority

Submission and Authority teaches that God establishes leaders to guide His people, requiring humble obedience (Hebrews 13:17), while also granting believers authority in Christ over spiritual forces (Ephesians 1:21). It's a dual dynamic of yielding and ruling. Students will learn to submit to godly oversight while exercising their spiritual power boldly. This course prepares them to navigate relationships and ministry with wisdom, ensuring harmony and effectiveness in God's work.

Philippians

Philippians, written by Paul from prison, radiates joy and unity in Christ, urging believers to rejoice always and imitate His humility (Philippians 2:5-8). It's a letter of encouragement amid hardship.

Philippians is a prison epistle as well as a Christocentric book, meaning that Jesus Christ is the central figure and focus of the entire epistle. The book of Philippians is characterized by its emphasis on:

- Christ's supremacy: Paul highlights Christ's lordship and sovereignty over all things (Philippians 2:9-11).
- Christ's humility: The famous "Christ Hymn" in Philippians 2:5-11 showcases Christ's self-emptying and humility.
- Christ's presence: Paul emphasizes the importance of knowing Christ and experiencing His presence in everyday life (Philippians 3:8-10).

- Christ's power: The book highlights Christ's power to transform lives, provide strength, and grant wisdom (Philippians 4:13, 19).

Throughout Philippians, Paul points his readers to Christ as the source of joy, peace, and contentment. The book is a powerful reminder of the centrality of Christ in the Christian life.

The Dynamics of Pastoral and Itinerant Ministry

Pastoral ministers shepherd a local flock with care and teaching, while itinerant ministers travel to preach and equip diverse churches, both requiring Spirit-led adaptability (1 Peter 5:2-4). Each serves God's kingdom uniquely.

Students will explore and discover their gifting and calling. In doing so they will be equipped with the right mentality to follow their divine calling. The course highlights flexibility, faithfulness, and reliance on God to impact lives wherever they are sent.

Christ in the Tabernacle and the Tabernacle in the Gospel of John

The tabernacle's elements—like the altar, lamp stand, and mercy seat—foreshadow Christ's sacrifice, priesthood, and intercession, fulfilled in His life and ministry (Hebrews 9:11-12). John's Gospel presents Jesus as the true tabernacle, God dwelling among us (John 1:14).

This course reveals to Pentecostal students the depth of Christ's redemptive work, inspiring worship and faith in His presence. It equips them to teach these truths, connecting Old Testament shadows to New Testament realities.

Developing a Strong Spirit

Developing a Strong Spirit means nurturing one's inner life through prayer, worship, and meditating on Scripture, making it robust against trials (Ephesians 3:16). It's the core of spiritual resilience.

For Pentecostals, this course ties strength to the Spirit's infilling, encouraging practices like speaking in tongues and fasting. It prepares students to stand firm in faith and ministry, relying on God's power within them to overcome challenges.

Excellence in Life and Ministry

Excellence in Life and Ministry calls believers to honor God by giving their best in character, work, and service, reflecting His perfection (Colossians 3:23). It's about glorifying Him in all things.

Pentecostal students learn to pursue excellence through the Spirit's enablement, impacting others with integrity and skill. The course equips them to lead and minister effectively, drawing people to Christ through a life well-lived.

COURSE 3

New Testament Survey - 2

New Testament Survey - 2 deepens analysis of the 27 books, exploring their theological themes—like grace, kingdom, and eschatology—and their relevance to modern faith. It connects the early church's experiences to today's Spirit-filled life.

Pentecostal students gain a richer grasp of Scripture's power to guide and transform, preparing them to teach and apply it in ministry. The course reinforces their reliance on the Holy Spirit to illuminate and activate God's Word.

Demonology

Demonology studies the origin, nature, and defeat of evil spirits, affirming Satan's fall and Christ's triumph over him (Colossians 2:15). It equips believers to recognize and resist demonic influence through spiritual authority.

For Pentecostals, this course emphasizes deliverance as a ministry of the Spirit, teaching students to pray with power and faith. It prepares them to confront darkness, bringing freedom to those oppressed by the enemy.

The Ministry of Healing and Deliverance

The Ministry of Healing and Deliverance follows Jesus' example of restoring body and soul, combining prayer for the sick with casting out demons (Mark 16:17-18). Understanding it's a sign of God's kingdom breaking in.

Pentecostal students learn to minister with compassion and boldness, trusting the Spirit's anointing for miracles. The course equips them

with practical steps and biblical foundations to see lives transformed by Christ's power.

Homiletics - Keys to Effective Preaching

Homiletics teaches the art of preparing and delivering sermons that communicate God's Word clearly and powerfully (2 Timothy 4:2). It blends study, structure, and Spirit-led delivery for impact.

For Pentecostals, this course emphasizes preaching with anointing, expecting the Spirit to convict and heal. It equips students to proclaim truth effectively, stirring faith and action in their hearers.

Eschatology - End of Days, Rapture, Tribulation, Second Coming (Daniel's 70th Weeks)

Eschatology examines the Bible's teachings on the last days—Christ's return, the rapture, tribulation, and kingdom—rooted in prophecies like Daniel's 70 weeks and Revelation. It assures believers of God's ultimate victory.

Pentecostal students explore these events with expectancy, seeing the Spirit's current work as a foretaste of the end. The course prepares them to live ready and preach hope, anticipating Jesus' soon return.

Time Management

Time Management applies biblical stewardship to daily life, using time wisely for God's glory (Ephesians 5:16). It balances priorities like prayer, ministry, and rest for maximum fruitfulness.

This course equips Pentecostal students to serve

effectively without burnout, relying on the Spirit for discipline. It fosters habits that align their schedules with God's purposes, enhancing their impact.

Turning Your Dreams into Realities

Turning Your Dreams into Realities teaches students to pursue God-given visions with faith and action, trusting His promises (Habakkuk 2:3). It's about seeing spiritual goals come to pass.

For Pentecostals, this course ties dreams to the Spirit's leading, encouraging prayer and persistence. It equips them to step out boldly, turning aspirations for ministry or revival into tangible outcomes.

Goal Setting and Ministry

Goal Setting and Ministry involves creating clear, Spirit-inspired objectives to advance God's work, grounded in faith and planning (Proverbs 16:9). It keeps ministry focused and fruitful.

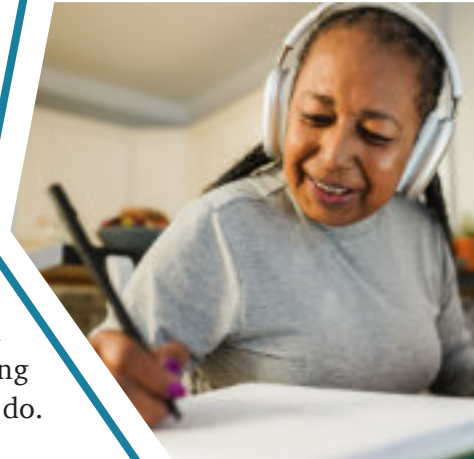

Characteristics of Strong Leadership

This course equips Pentecostal students to lead

with boldness and humility, fostering unity and growth in the church. It prepares them to shepherd effectively, reflecting Christ's heart in all they do.



The Book of Acts

Acts chronicles the Spirit's outpouring and the early church's growth, showcasing miracles, boldness, and mission (Acts 1:8). It's a blueprint for Pentecostal life and ministry today.

Students explore how the Spirit empowered ordinary believers to change the world, inspiring them to seek the same power. The course equips them to live and lead with Acts-like faith, expecting God to move mightily.

Daniel and Revelation

Daniel and Revelation unveil God's prophetic plan through visions of empires, tribulation, and Christ's return as King (Daniel 7, Revelation 19). They assure believers of His sovereign control.

For Pentecostals, this course stirs anticipation for the end times and the Spirit's role in preparing the church. It equips them to teach these truths, calling others to readiness and worship of the coming Lord.

Old Testament Survey

Old Testament Survey covers the 39 books of law, history, and prophecy, revealing God's character, covenants, and promise of a Messiah.

For Pentecostals, this course emphasizes the Spirit's guidance and power in launching ministry, whether local or global. It equips students to begin with humility, trusting God to grow their calling into lasting impact.

Ministry and Business - Raising Kingdom Millionaires

Ministry and Business blends entrepreneurial skills with kingdom purpose, teaching how to use wealth to fund

God's work (Deuteronomy 8:18). It's about prospering to bless others and advance the Gospel.

Pentecostal students learn to operate in faith and wisdom, expecting the Spirit to bless their efforts. The course prepares them to raise resources ethically, fueling missions and ministry with financial strength.

Deliverance Ministry

Deliverance ministry, a defining feature of Pentecostal Christianity, teaches that ministers and believers can exercise the authority granted by Christ, through prayer and spiritual engagement to free people from demonic oppression. This module explores its foundations in Scripture, its historical development, and its contemporary application. It focuses on the ministry of Jesus, the practices of the early church, and the worldwide revival it sparked. While Western interpretations of the Gospel have often stripped away its supernatural aspects, this module follows the path of deliverance ministry from Jesus' time to its explosive growth within global Pentecostalism. It examines key teachings such as spiritual warfare, generational

curses, ancestral spirits, and bloodline issues, while addressing criticisms of excessive sensationalism.

Through a series of lectures, we will provide biblical examples and a thoughtful analysis to maintain theological soundness, cultural awareness, and psychological care.
